Minority Report: A Sociological Account of Muslim Immigrants in Canada

Debates about Canadian Muslims have focussed on theology or culture; treated Muslims as a monolithic population; and paid little attention to the specificities of local contexts. As a result, they have oversimplified complex social realities and offered poor guides to policy. Professor Kazemipur overcomes these problems by employing a wide range of socioeconomic data to argue for a sociologically grounded account of Muslims in Canada.

Professor Kazemipur's <u>The Muslim Question in Canada: A Story of Segmented Integration</u> (Vancouver: University of British Columbia Press, 2014) won the John Porter Prize of the Canadian Sociological Association for the outstanding book in Canadian sociology, 2015.
